UCARE-funded research nurse now full-time

In UCARE's first newsletter (Summer 2008) we announced our supporters had helped us to fund a grant to pay for a part-time research nurse at Churchill Hospital. Now, with your support, we have raised enough funds to make the post full-time.

Working within a multidisciplinary team, the research nurse plays a vital role in the advance of urology research trials in Oxford. The research nurse supports cancer patients undergoing clinical trials, who are unique in their care regime. The role also involves facilitating the collection of tissue samples for laboratory research, promoting the research trials, and disseminating information about research activities to other staff and to the public. Thanks to all UCARE's supporters who have helped us to fund this crucial post.

Testicular cancer patients, who may choose to remain anonymous, can visit the site at any time of the day or night to 'chat' with each other online. The service has received excellent feedback from patients and from clinicians who want to set up similar resources.
